**Union Township,

Elevation: 708'**

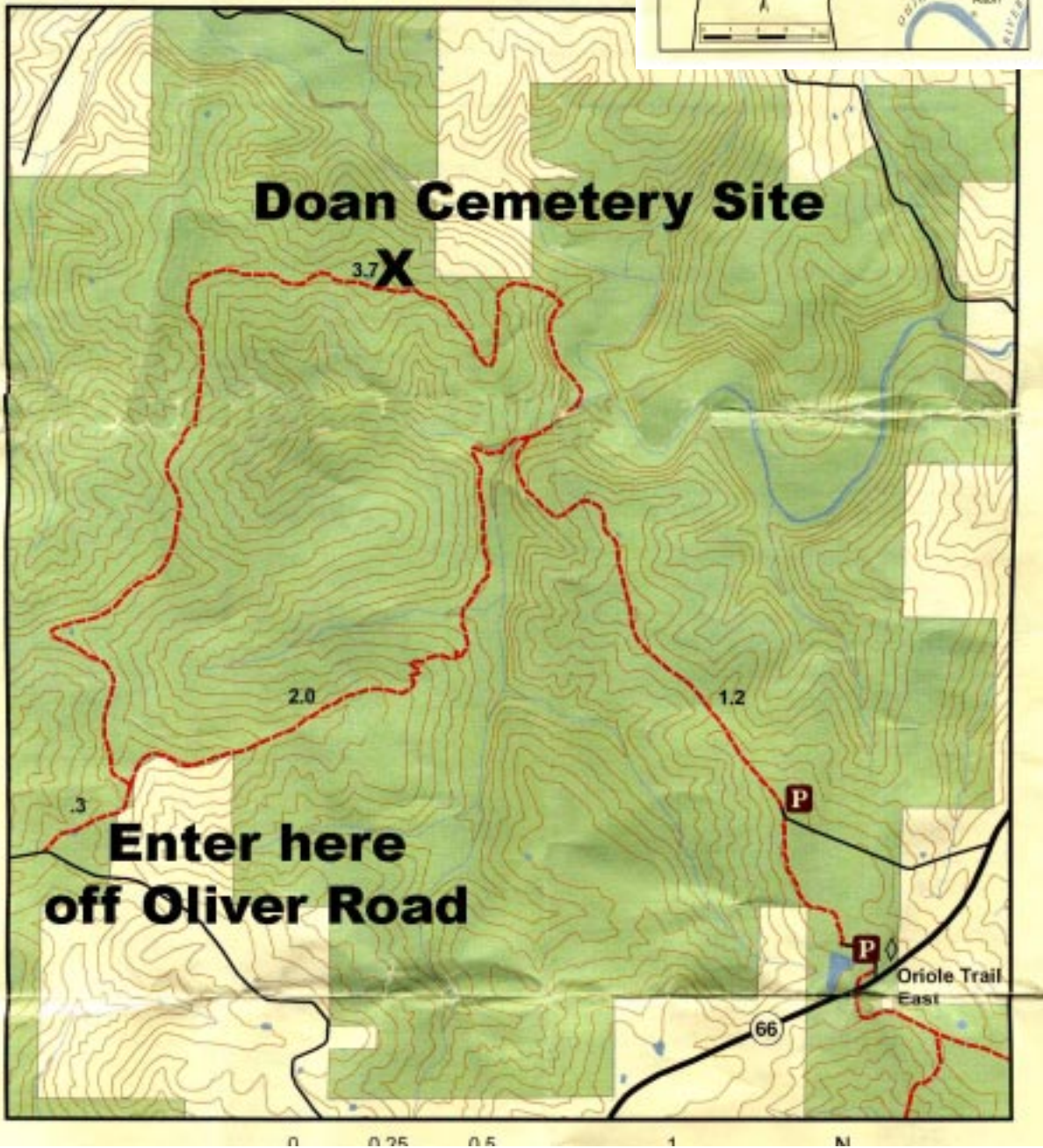
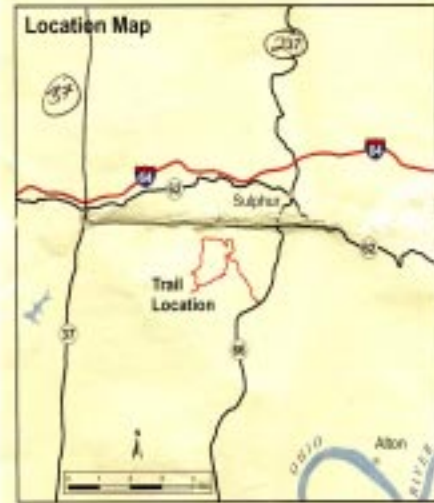

According to Crawford County Cemetery Records, there are only two graves in this country cemetery and neither are readable:

William "Bill" Doan, died March 6, 1908, a Civil War Vet, Co G, 42nd Reg. IN Inf. Vol. Resided in Daviess Co when he enrolled in 1861 at age 25 and was discharged in 1864. Pension applied for in 1880. Resided in West Fork, in 1894. Born: July 1836. Widow: Eva A. (from Crawford Co., IN Civil War Veterans, by Doris Leistner).

James W. "Barnie" Doan, died in 1932. Son of William & Effie Doan. Born: 1868.

James “Barnie” Doan, listed as being also buried in this family plot (Born: 1848 - Died 1932) is assumed to be the son of William Doan and more of the family may be buried here in unmarked graves.
